The Committee welcomed the new Chief, Emilee Nottestad, and thanked Chief Dave Kuderer for his years of service and wished him well on his retirement.


There were no items mentioned for future consideration.




Note-worthy Calls:

- Oversight of special holiday events: Holiday Train, Santa Scamper, Holiday Parade, etc.
- On December 10, officers responded to a home intruder in the 300-block of Stelling. The intruder was discovered hiding in a closet by the home owner due to a barking dog. When the home owner went to the closet door where the dog was barking, she was unable to open it and noticed fingers protruding from under the closet door, holding the door shut. The intruder then began speaking to the home owner, stating, "You're going to ruin the Christmas surprise! Ho Ho Ho!" He then told her to leave the room so as not to ruin the surprise. The home owner waited in the hallway for the intruder to come out of the closet, at which point the intruder told her that Jesus sent him.
